INVENTREK RECEIVES TECH PARK RECERTIFICATION FROM STATE

In May 2024, Inventrek Tech Park successfully secured its Certified Technology Park redesignation for another four years, ensuring continued access to resources that fuel innovation and business growth.

This designation reinforces the park's critical role in supporting entrepreneurs and high-growth companies in Kokomo.

The impact of this designation is clearly evident

in the park's contributions to the local and state economy. A recent economic impact study found that Inventrek generated \$29 million for Howard County and \$37 million for the state in 2023 alone.

By fostering technological advancement and attracting new investment, Inventrek continues to be a powerful driver of economic growth in the region.

LINKED TO THE FUTURE SERIES:

New initiative empowers small businesses to grow, succeed



L launched in 2024, the Linked to the Future series, a collaborative initiative between Inventrek Tech Park and the Hoosier Heartland ISBDC, is aimed at helping small business owners address the critical challenges they face daily. This new series offers hour-long, expert-led sessions focused on essential topics like cybersecurity, marketing, and financial management.

Designed with practical, actionable takeaways, each session provides personalized advice that helps business owners solve problems and

strengthen their operations without breaking the bank.

Understanding that small business owners often juggle multiple roles, from CEO to IT specialist, the series provides an invaluable opportunity to focus on solving key pain points that can hold a business back.

These sessions offer clear steps to implement right away. In addition, the ability to attend the sessions either in person at Inventrek or virtually via Zoom gives business owners the flexibility to learn

on their own schedule.

Those attending leave these sessions equipped with actionable steps they can take immediately – and in many cases, at no cost – to strengthen and protect their business. Attending these sessions also affords business owners and entrepreneurs the opportunity to ask local experts questions specific to their business and receive tailored advice.



WHY IT MATTERS: By equipping entrepreneurs with the knowledge and tools they need to thrive, Linked to the Future helps foster a stronger, more resilient small business community. These accessible, expert-driven sessions are a cost-effective way to ensure businesses stay competitive and grow sustainably – helping avoid costly mistakes and build a solid foundation.

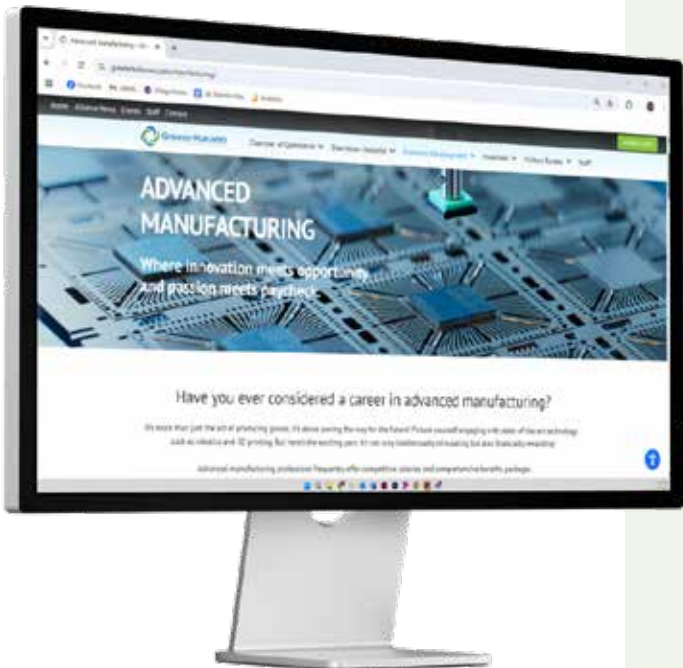
GM COMMUNITY IMPACT GRANT: Bridging education and industry to ensure a skilled local workforce

A significant technology transfer effort in 2024 was the GM Community Impact Grant project in collaboration with Chris Lagoni of Next Tier Analytics. This initiative not only produced an in-depth study examining how the Core 40 diploma aligns with the skills required for advanced “smart” manufacturing — but also directly connected educational outcomes to real-world industry demands.



The project’s deliverables (including marketing collateral such as mousepads, postcards, and phone wallets embedded with QR codes) have enhanced access to local workforce pathway information for graduating high schoolers.

This initiative has created a seamless transfer of industry-relevant technology know-how to the community, ensuring that our emerging talent is ready to meet the evolving needs of Indiana’s high-tech manufacturers.

Innovation in Kokomo
The demand for advanced manufacturing jobs is at an all-time high, with a special focus on clean energy within our own city. StarPlus Energy has invested over \$6.3 billion, creating 2,800 new jobs in Kokomo at its incoming EV battery plants.

A strong workforce
Manufacturing holds a significant role in our community, constituting 28.7% of all jobs. This sector's robust presence underscores its vital contribution to local employment and economic stability of the entire region.

Where passion meets paycheck.

The MIT Living Wage Calculator in 2021 documented that a single person in Indiana needs to earn \$27,955 per year to meet the basic needs of food, housing, health insurance and personal expenses.

According to In Demand Jobs Indiana, advanced manufacturing is one of the most highly needed careers in the Kokomo area as well as north central Indiana. The top jobs of 2024 in advanced manufacturing and the average salary for the positions are as follows:

Grant funds used to connect students to careers in advanced manufacturing

As part of the GM Community Impact Grant initiative, a series of postcards and phone wallets were created to introduce high school students to career opportunities in advanced manufacturing.

ADDITIONAL TECHNOLOGY

TRANSFER ACTIVITIES:

Purdue MEP Training Sessions:

A pivotal contributor to the local technology-based economy has been our engagement with Purdue's Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP). Facilitated by Emily Logsdon, these training sessions not only offer in-depth technical education and industry best practices, but also serve as a critical conduit for capitalizing on smart manufacturing opportunities.

The regular cadence of these sessions has helped raise the technical skills of local talent, ensuring that Indiana's tech workforce is well-prepared to contribute to and sustain the growth of high-tech industries.

Topics have included process optimization, leadership development, team management, productive management, lean manufacturing and more.



IOT Roadshow

Initially slated to be hosted at Inventrek, the IOT Roadshow was conceived as an innovative platform to demonstrate the ways it is possible for our local manufacturing companies to integrate technology into their production processes.

While the event later transitioned to Ivy Tech Community College, our early collaboration helped forge critical partnerships with high-tech employers like HMH and SPE, transferring valuable technology insights to our local ecosystem.

BRE visits with local manufacturers

Visits to companies like Lorentson Manufacturing, Hollingsworth Lumber, and GM provided tailored technical consultations.

These interactions have allowed us to transfer best practices and innovative manufacturing techniques that bolster the overall competitiveness of our local industry.

HMH Mechanical Engagement

A BRE visit to HMH Mechanical revealed its state-of-the-art 3D modeling techniques used in advanced manufacturing – knowledge that has been shared with our network.

Their demonstration in a real-world context (for example, on a project for a new gene therapy research lab) underscores how technology transfer can improve operational efficiency and push the boundaries of local manufacturing practices.

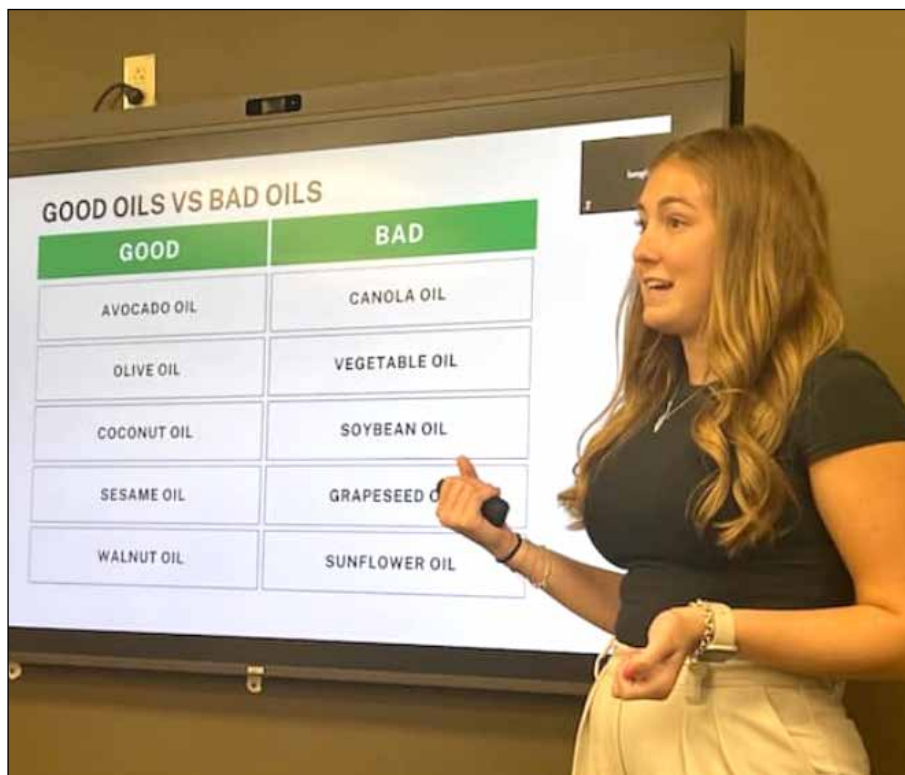

ACCELERATING INNOVATION

Annual competition continues to spur entrepreneurial growth

In 2024, the Drive competition – Inventrek Tech Park’s Shark Tank-style business pitch event – continued to grow, drawing an increasing number of local entrepreneurs eager to showcase their innovative ideas.

The 2024 contest, which was open to startups and expanding businesses in Howard County, provided a dynamic platform for participants to refine their business plans and pitches before a panel of judges, with the \$10,000 grand prize awarded to Luke Talley of Back Woods Trading Company.

In addition, the competition introduced the new CTP Jumpstart grant, awarding \$2,500 to Crystina Diaz of The Kingdom Kids Learning Center, further expanding support for emerging businesses.

WHY IT MATTERS. With each year, the contest builds momentum, offering critical resources and mentorship that not only fuel individual business growth but also strengthen the region’s overall economic landscape.

Looking ahead to 2025

For the 2025 competition, the timeline has been adjusted to provide local entrepreneurs with more time for mentorship and pitch refinement. The extended timeline ensures that participants receive the necessary support to enhance their business ideas and better prepare for their final presentations.

This change allows for deeper engagement with mentors, more opportunities for feedback, and a more thorough refinement process, all aimed at increasing the overall quality and success rate of pitches.

By providing additional time, we are helping entrepreneurs develop stronger business models that are better positioned for long-term success.



MAKING CONNECTIONS THAT BOOST THE TECH-BASED ECONOMY:

Building strong relationships and partnerships is a cornerstone of the Inventrek mission. By fostering collaboration between entrepreneurs, businesses, mentors, and community organizations, we create a network that supports innovation and growth. Built to Succeed and Ascend Indiana

These initiatives have laid the groundwork for apprenticeship programs and expanded job board opportunities—connecting high school and college students with employers. They serve as models for how targeted programs can stimulate both talent development and capital investment in the region.

BIC and Battery Lab Discussions

Although discussions with the Battery Innovation Center (BIC) did not culminate in a fully realized battery education lab, the dialogue underscored our commitment to developing the local tech workforce pipeline. Continued dialogue in this area promises future capital investments and product innovations.

Other strategic relationships (with Duke Energy, BerryComm, and collaborative research through the Purdue TAP40 Podcast Studio study) have contributed to a diverse range of technology-based products and solutions that support the broader economy.

INVENTREK: A launchpad for StarPlus Energy suppliers and a catalyst for EV innovation

Inventrek Tech Park has played a pivotal role in supporting the development of StarPlus Energy's electric vehicle battery plants — a transformative \$6.4 billion investment in Kokomo that is reshaping Indiana's economic landscape and accelerating the future of clean energy. Over the past two years, Inventrek has welcomed 11 suppliers and OEMs, including seven Korean-based companies, serving as their initial foothold in Kokomo's expanding EV and advanced manufacturing sector.

By providing accessible office space, collaborative resources, and on-the-ground support, Inventrek enabled these companies to establish local operations quickly and efficiently — a critical factor in keeping pace with the fast-moving demands of the electric vehicle supply chain. This strategic positioning has not only advanced supplier integration into the regional ecosystem but also further solidified Kokomo's standing as a hub for automotive innovation.

StarPlus Energy was named one of Indiana's Top 10 Best Tech Startups by The Tech Tribune in 2024, highlighting the project's importance not just to Kokomo, but to the entire state's tech economy. Inventrek's connection to that momentum extends beyond current supplier support — it played a meaningful role in making the StarPlus development possible.

As a division of the Greater Kokomo Economic Development Alliance, Inventrek was directly involved in the foundational work that helped Kokomo secure the original StarPlus Energy investment. In partnership with the City of Kokomo and Howard County, the Alliance acquired 142 acres of land in late 2021 to develop a new industrial park. That bold, proactive step positioned the community to compete — and ultimately succeed — in attracting one of the largest EV battery manufacturing investments in the nation.

This is a clear example of the value Inventrek and the Alliance bring to major tech-forward economic development initiatives. By combining foresight, infrastructure readiness, and on-the-ground business support, Inventrek Tech Park continues to drive the success of Kokomo's tech economy — from early-stage startups to global-scale advanced manufacturing.

ENGAGEMENT WITH CTP COMPANIES

These efforts reaffirm our commitment to not only providing space for business growth but also ensuring that every company within Inventrek has access to the tools, resources, and network they need to succeed at every stage of their journey.

MEDIA & COMMUNICATION

At Inventrek, we remain intentional in fostering communication and engagement with each company within the CTP. Under the Inventrek/Alliance umbrella, our communications team manages two monthly newsletters and a total of 15 social media accounts across multiple platforms to promote awareness of initiatives, programs, and opportunities.

These efforts ensure that businesses within Inventrek stay informed and connected while also amplifying their reach to the broader Kokomo business community.

NETWORKING, EVENTS & TRAINING

Inventrek continues to serve as the home base for a growing number of networking events, small conferences, and business training sessions.

In 2024, over 100 events took place, providing critical resources and connections for businesses within the park and the greater Kokomo community.

IU KOKOMO MBA RESEARCH PROJECT

Through collaborative research projects (e.g., the market study conducted by IUK MBA students), we have been able to gather critical insights into regional business dynamics, enhancing our strategic planning and engagement efforts.

LEADERSHIP KOKOMO & KOKOMO CEO

A cornerstone of our annual engagement strategy has been the yearly presentation to Leadership Kokomo and the Kokomo CEO. This comprehensive session is designed to highlight Inventrek's multifaceted support for the local tech economy.

The sessions provide an in-depth look at how our initiatives translate into tangible benefits for each company within the CTP, reinforcing our commitment to collaborative growth and strategic investment in the tech park's success.

KOREAN SOFT LANDING INITIATIVE

Building on the success of our Korean Soft Landing initiative, 2024 saw further enhancements to WelcomeToKokomo.com, a dedicated resource hub for professionals relocating from Seoul to Kokomo as part of the StarPlus Energy project.

Through this initiative, Inventrek continues to play a pivotal role in connecting incoming Korean businesses and employees with local resources, while also equipping local businesses with the cultural and business tools needed to form successful partnerships.

BRE VISITS WITH TECH COMPANIES

In-person visits to local manufacturing firms (such as Lorentson, Hollingsworth

Lumber, and GM) have allowed us to provide tailored advice and foster stronger business relationships, ensuring that our engagement remains hands-on and impactful.

COUNCILS & BOARDS

Inventrek and GKEDA continue to operate under the governance of multiple boards and councils, including the Inventrek Council, which meets bimonthly.

Composed of local entrepreneurs — including current Inventrek tenants and businesses that have since grown into their own locations — the council provides a structured platform for valuable feedback and discussion. This consistent engagement ensures that the voices of our business community shape the direction of Inventrek's programs and offerings, keeping our support services relevant and impactful.

KOKOMO AREA CAREER FAIR PARTICIPATION

Our active volunteer role at the Kokomo Area Career Fair has helped spotlight local educational initiatives and the tech-related career pathways we support.

ADDITIONAL OUTREACH

Smaller-scale initiatives, including speaking events (e.g., at Northwestern HS JAG sessions) and targeted presentations, continue to round out our annual engagement strategy by reaching diverse audiences and reinforcing our community-focused mission.

A LOOK TO THE FUTURE

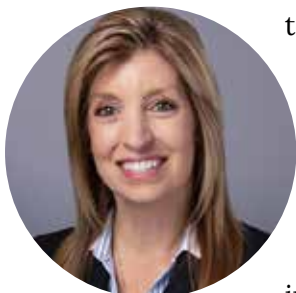


As we close this annual report, I want to take a moment to reflect on our journey at Inventrek Tech Park and share our vision for the future.
